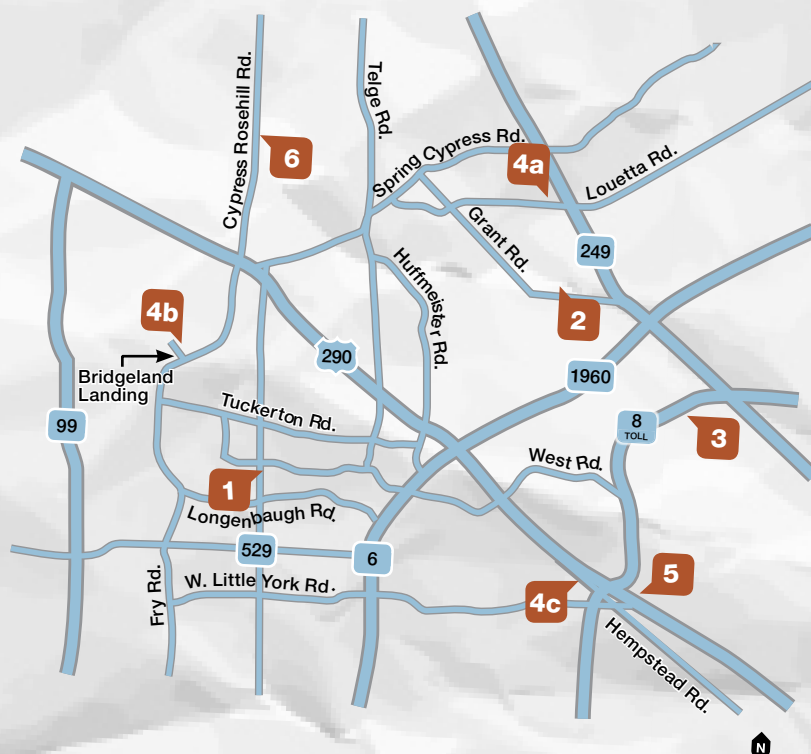


# the Cy-Fair BUCKET LIST

### THE CYPRESS CREEK GREENWAY

When complete the Cypress Creek Greenway will connect a series of parks and trails spanning 40 miles from Hwy. 290 eastward to the Spring Creek Greenway. The Cypress Creek Greenway will be considered the largest stretch of parks in the nation when complete.

### AT K1 SPEED

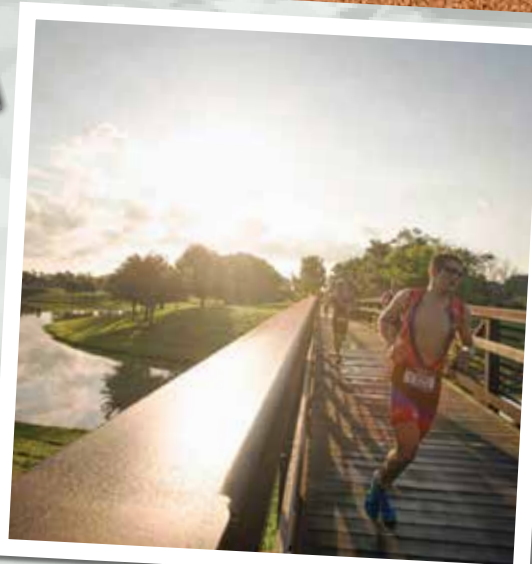
