Sharon Krienke has lived in Cedar Park since 1971, before the city was incorporated. With the north fork of Brushy Creek and Spanish Oak Creek coming through her family's property, she said they have witnessed a fair share of flooding over the years.

"We're used to it," Krienke said. "We had times we couldn't go across the bridge on Brushy Creek for sometimes

weeks because the water would stay across it."

Though flooding in Central Texas is nothing new, federal and local entities are addressing the issue in new ways in 2019. The Federal Emergency Management Agency is revising flood plain maps that determine whether homeowners must purchase flood insurance. In Cedar Park, a voter-approved stormwater program is

making headway.

The FEMA updates are the result of a seven-year collaborative effort in Williamson County to update the area's flood insurance rate map. The new map, which FEMA is expecting to finalize in the fall, will affect hundreds of Williamson County residents as properties receive or lose flood-risk designations.

North Brushy Street construction in Old Town Leander experiences weather delays

BY MARISA CHARPENTIER

After facing numerous weather delays, construction on North Brushy Street is expected to be complete by May at the latest, according to City Engineer Wayne Watts.

Improvements to North Brushy began in June and include reconstruction of two blocks of the street, construction of sidewalks and landscaping, the installation of a storm drainage system and additional parking, and more.

Funding for the \$1.9 million project, which is located in Old Town Leander, comes from Leander general obligation bonds.

Watts said the goal of the streetscape project is to improve the aesthetics and land values in the area.

"It improves the usefulness and attractiveness of the area for city events, chamber [of commerce] events, Christmas festivals and spring festivals," Watts said. "It basically brings us into a more modern look."

Although the project was expected to be substantially complete in December, Watts said rain has caused continued delays. He said paving is expected to be complete in late March, and landscaping should be complete in April. The goal, Watts said, is that everything is finished by May, in time for the annual Old Town Street Festival, which is scheduled for May 18.

Several businesses are located on the portion of North Brushy that is under construction, including the Leander Beer Market and Bella's Beauty Salon. Genc Krasniqi, co-owner of Leander Beer Market, said since construction began, sales have dropped about 40 percent. However, he said he is excited for what the project has in store.

"It will make a tremendous impact and make the city look good. ..." Krasniqi said. "We support it and were very excited about it from day one."





The new map is based on a recent watershed study by the Upper Brushy Creek Water Control and Improvement District, the operator of flood-control structures in the Upper Brushy Creek Watershed.

Insurance companies use FEMA's flood insurance rate maps to determine if flood insurance is legally mandated for a property. Congress mandates that federally regulated or insured lenders require flood insurance on mortgaged properties that are in high-risk flooding areas. Even if properties are not located in these areas, mortgage lenders may still require flood insurance, according to FEMA's website.

Michael Lafferty, a certified flood plain manager with the city of Leander, said he does not know how many properties in Leander will move into or out of the flood plain in the new maps. In early 2018, cities had a chance to submit appeals based on the preliminary map. Lafferty said the city submitted appeals regarding a few subdivisions and is still waiting to hear back from FEMA to see if those subdivisions will be in the flood plain in the new map.

"In general, I would say the flood plain has gotten larger," Lafferty said. "But as far as individual property, depending on where you are in the city, it could be a very small change, almost insignificant. There are some areas where there are significant boundary increases, but it's kind of on a case-by-case [basis]."

The new map shows structures moving into and out of the flood plain in Cedar Park, according to Darwin Marchell, the director of engineering for the city of Cedar Park. Marchell said in an email there are 352 structures in a current FEMA flood plain zone and 384 structures in the proposed map.

Data for the Upper Brushy Creek Watershed Study was compiled by Williamson County and multiple municipalities, including Leander and Cedar Park. The new maps were developed using updated development information, detailed topographical data and modern technology, providing an extensive update the area has not seen in nearly three decades.

Leander City Engineer Wayne Watts said the



area's flood insurance rate map was last updated in 2008 and was based on work that was done in 1991. Both Leander and Cedar Park have seen significant growth since then.

Watts said the Upper Brushy Creek Watershed Study was based on a 2012 snapshot of Leander.

"Lots of things have happened in Leander since 2012, like during that [time], doubling the population," Watts said.

Watts said once the map is finalized, city staff plans on sending more updates to FEMA based on newer data.

'FLASH FLOOD ALLEY'

Central Texas is nicknamed "Flash Flood Alley," according to KVUE chief meteorologist Albert Ramon. Ramon said flooding occurs here because of the area's proximity to the Gulf of Mexico and the nature of the area's topography.

"It really only takes an isolated thunderstorm that sits over an area for a short period of time, mainly west of the interstate, to cause some issues," Ramon said.

Ramon said moving west of I-35, the amount of soil decreases, and limestone is not far below the surface.

"So if you think of the soil as a sponge, it doesn't take a whole lot of rainfall for you to get saturated soil and then in turn cause runoff to low-water crossings," Ramon said.

Low-water crossings are roads that intersect either a low area or a creek, Ramon said. He said while Austin experiences urban and street flooding due to the amount of concrete it has, issues in Cedar Park and Leander typically stem from low-water crossings.

Ramon said the past winter and fall have seen above-average rainfall, and the rest of winter and spring will likely be wetter than average due to that rainfall.

"Soil is going to stay saturated; lakes are up," Ramon said. "Several inches of rainfall in the wrong place can cause some big-time issues."

NEW STORMWATER PROGRAM IN CEDAR PARK

One of the most notable steps Cedar Park is taking to address flooding is creating a new stormwater

drainage program. Voters approved a proposition in May allowing for the redirection of a portion of sales tax revenue to fund the program. The program handles infrastructure projects; provides maintenance of drainage infrastructures, such as creeks, ponds and ditches; and handles permits.

The stormwater program is now in the process of prioritizing 19 critical drainage projects, such as areas of Block House Creek, Riviera Springs and Deer Run. These 19 problem areas were discovered after the city hired a consulting firm to identify problem areas in 2016. Emily Truman, the stormwater program manager, gave an update on the program at a Dec. 13 City Council meeting.

"We are now working on prioritizing these projects with an updated criteria that focuses on the protection of property and structures as well as public safety," Truman said at the meeting.

Truman said the ranking of these projects should go before City Council for comment and approval in early 2019. The ranking will then serve as a guide for implementing the projects.

Marchell said flooding mainly occurs in older areas that were developed before Cedar Park was incorporated and therefore were not designed to city drainage standards. He said most of the drainage projects the city will be focusing on address flooding in these places.

Watts said the city of Leander does not have flooding-related projects in the works at this time, and the city has not seen a need to create its own stormwater program.

"I'm not expecting to do so because of our topography," Watts said.

As a longtime Cedar Park resident, Krienke said she is in favor of the steps Cedar Park is taking to improve drainage through its new program.

"I think all towns ought to implement things like that," Krienke said. "Work on it before it happens. It saves the taxpayers and the landowners a lot of problems."

Leander ISD expects to pay millions into state 'Robin Hood' system


THE LATEST: Leander ISD will set the 2019-20 budget this year, which may have to take into account state recapture costs. Texas school districts deemed "property-wealthy" must share property tax revenue with "property-poor" districts through Chapter 41 of Texas Education Code, commonly known as the "Robin Hood" system.

Classified as a Chapter 41 district since 2009, LISD has not yet been required to pay significant recapture costs. However, LISD expects to begin paying into the system in the 2019-20 academic year, paying approximately \$3 million through installments from February through August 2020.

The exact recapture costs over the upcoming years are dependent on property value growth and the decisions of the 86th Legislature, which could decide to alter the laws. LISD Chief Financial Officer Lucas Janda said if the legislature ends in May, the district will have the information in time for budget adoption.

RECAPTURE COSTS

Leander ISD could begin paying into the state's recapture system during the 2019-20 academic year. Scenario 1 shows possible costs with 4 percent property value growth while Scenario 2 considers 10 percent growth in 2019-20 and 4 percent the following years.

Mixed-use developments in Cedar Park, Leander advance

WHAT WE REPORTED: Several mixed-use projects, which can include retail, office, restaurant, housing and other uses, are in the works in Cedar Park, such as Indigo Ridge North and Presidio. The city of Cedar Park is also planning to redevelop the area around Bell Boulevard between Buttercup Creek Boulevard and Park Street as a new mixed-use district. Leander City Council approved up to \$15 million in infrastructure funding for Northline, a proposed mixed-use project near Toll 183A.

THE LATEST: Cedar Park City Council selected RedLeaf Properties Jan. 10 to be the master developer partner with the city for the Bell Boulevard redevelopment project. Developer Alex Tynberg said Northline is expected to break ground in mid-2019. Indigo Ridge North developer Todd Madden said he submitted a site development permit request to the city of Cedar Park for a large part of the Village District—which could include shopping, a hotel and more. The Presidio project grew to around 200 acres at the end of 2018. Alamo Drafthouse will break ground at Presidio in the spring.

MIXED-USE DEVELOPMENTS

Several area mixed-use developments are in the works.





LISD builds new schools in northern part of district

WHAT WE REPORTED: Leander ISD's 2017 bond will pay for several new schools. Most population growth is expected in the northern portion of the district, which is where the schools are being built according to a fall 2018 demographic report by Population and Survey Analysts.

THE LATEST: LISD's 27th elementary school, Lark-spur Elementary School, will open in 2019. The district's ninth middle school—named in honor of Stacy Danielson, Cedar Park High School's former dance director who died of cancer last summer—opens in 2020 across from Glenn High School. The school board discussed the attendance zoning process for Stacy Danielson Middle School Jan. 10.

5 RM 1431 project could be finished in summer

WHAT WE REPORTED: The Texas Department of Transportation began the RM 1431 "Gap Project" in early 2017 to widen the road to six lanes from Market Street to Cottonwood Creek Trail.

THE LATEST: TxDOT is working on the middle of the road, including a median. The project is expected to be complete in the summer.

6 Expansions underway for regional water intake system


THE LATEST: The Brushy Creek Regional Utility Authority is a partnership among Cedar Park, Leander and Round Rock to bring water from Lake Travis to the cities. The BCRUA starts construction on the expansion of the floating water intake on Lake Travis and water treatment plant this year. This phase could be completed in summer 2020 and will expand the intake's capacity to 32.5 million gallons of water per day.

Cedar Park, Leander to elect new city council members

THE LATEST: Places 1, 3 and 5 on city councils in both Leander and Cedar Park are up for re-election in May.

Those are the seats of Stephen Thomas, Mayor Pro Tem Anne Duffy and Heather Jefts in Cedar Park. The seats of Andrea Navarrette, Shanan Shepherd and Jeff Seiler are up for re-election in Leander.

Election day will be May 4. Residents interested in running for election may file to run Jan. 16-Feb. 15.

8 Police eye improvements

WHAT WE REPORTED: In July, a firm hired to review the Cedar Park Police Department recommended a staffing analysis and more training, supervision and documentation of the criminal investigations division. The Leander Police Department acquired a police dog in 2018.

THE LATEST: Cedar Park Police Chief Sean Mannix said 2019 will see the completion of the staffing study and five-year strategic plan in the spring. Leander Police Chief Greg Minton said the criminal investigations division now has a computer forensic lab and plans to hire two new detectives early this year.

Major parks under development

WHAT WE REPORTED: The city of Leander is developing a Parks, Recreation and Open Space Comprehensive Plan. New parks projects are underway in both cities, including Lakewood Park in Leander and Lakeline Park in Cedar Park.

THE LATEST: Leander's parks comprehensive plan will be debuted to City Council in March. The first phase of Lakewood Park could open in October, and construction on Leander's senior activity center is expected to begin in the summer. Lakeline Park, which will be Cedar Park's largest park, will be under design in 2019.

Williamson County preps for the potential effects of a new Apple campus

THE LATEST: Apple announced in December it would build a second Northwest Austin campus on the corner of McNeil Drive and Parmer Lane, where it will initially hire 5,000 new employees. That number could grow to 15,000 employees over time. Williamson County Commissioners Court approved an economic incentive deal with Apple. In exchange for investing \$400 million in purchasing the land and developing the campus as well as creating 4,000 new jobs, Williamson County would abate or reimburse 65 percent of ad valorem taxes for real and business personal property for 15 years totaling \$16 million in reimbursements to Apple.

"Everyone came together to see the greater good," said Ben White, Cedar Park's director of economic development. "It's a unique situation we find ourselves in in Williamson County. We all play together; we all win together."

Austin's surrounding communities are likely to see a spillover of new Apple employees buying houses or filling rental properties, according to several local Realtors.

Cedar Park doughnut shop bakes treats 'with love'

ophia Sarou thinks of her grandmother whenever she smells warm doughnuts. She remembers her childhood in Massachusetts, where in the morning her grandmother would slip a doughnut into the toaster oven and then dip it in her coffee.

Nowadays Sarou, co-owner of Nathalie's Donuts in Cedar Park, is surrounded by doughnuts daily. She and her family moved to Texas and opened Nathalie's Donuts in 2010.

"The Boston area is really expensive, so [we said], 'Let's try out Texas,'" Sarou said. "I came up to visit, and I fell in love with Austin."

The endeavor was a family effort. Her mother, Ponnavy Yen, is the other co-owner, and Sarou's brother helped set up the shop. 

LOCAL AND HERE TO STAY

Many area residents experience cold-type symptoms or worse periodically from December through March.

"It's the Ashe juniper, or Juniperus ashei, and it's debilitating," said Jim Rooni, head of Central Texas operations for the Texas A&M Forest Service.

Rooni said there are plenty of misconceptions about the tree, including that it is a cedar tree.

Female Ashe junipers have berries and cones, while male trees cause the airborne pollen. The trees are not an invasive species.

"We have 10 million acres of them in Central and West Texas," Rooni said.

Rooni said controlled burns by ranchers and wildfires reset the onslaught of Ashe junipers taking over the landscape. Development has cut down on the ability to conduct controlled burns. Rooni said a large expense for ranchers is managing the species; while homeowners can trim the trees back, they are in a losing battle.

HEALTH ISSUES FOR MANY

As juniper counts rise, TV meteorologists, including Fox 7 Austin's Scott Fisher, report the numbers on each newscast on the website.

"It has been a super wet fall, and absolutely everything points to a rough season," Fisher said.

Those new to Texas may not experience this round of cedar fever.

"The first year here is usually a honeymoon," said Rhiannon Ringo, an allergy and immunology physician assistant at Baylor Scott & White in Round Rock. "After that a lot of people suffer the symptoms of cedar fever. ..."

For those sensitive to pollen, Ringo suggested planning indoor activities on windy days. She said there are over-the-counter medications and saline nasal sprays and drops available that can help combat symptoms.

After the first bout, Ringo suggests setting an appointment with a board-certified allergist to figure out the best line of attack going forward.

NOT ALL BAD

While the Ashe juniper may wreak havoc on our immune system, many receive help they need through their doctor, while others build a tolerance.

Rooni, who came to Texas 25 years ago from Wisconsin, said as a forester he does not have the option of staying indoors. He said his immune system has adjusted, and the effects of cedar fever are minimal. Rooni also said the juniper has some positive effects on the ecosystem.

"Birds and critters have used it successfully for habitat," Rooni said. "It's also good [at] protecting against erosion in this area. The one issue we have is when there are thick canopies, they actually keep water from ever reaching the soil. They take only so much water and then it evaporates without ever reaching the ground."

A website often pointed to online by allergy sufferers, www.pollen.com, listed Austin as fourth worst for allergy sufferers in the United States for several days in early January. The top five were all Texas cities, with the top allergen culprit being the Ashe juniper.

On Jan. 15, 73 percent of the United States was in the low pollen category, according to www.pollen.com. All of Texas was elevated to at least medium-low, with the highest counts in the Hill Country and in the Dallas and San Antonio areas.

"It's a much-maligned species for several reasons," Rooni said. "And it's here to stay. People need to drop the chainsaw and alleviate the symptoms."

ALL ABOUT THE ASHE JUNIPER TREE

There are ten million acres of Ashe juniper trees in the Edwards Plateau, which includes 41 of Texas' 256 counties. That is 5.97 percent of the 167,624,960 acres in Texas. Cedar fever season is December through March, with the highest numbers typically in January and February. Here are facts about the ongoing season.

THE GOOD



The trees provide cover for 191 bird species and 64 mammal species in the region.



Ashe junipers help slow erosion in the Hill Country.



The trees stay green year-round, while the rest go dormant or lose leaves.

THE BAD



The trees are drought-tolerant.



In high concentration, the canopy formed by the trees absorbs rain and does not allow it to hit the soil, adding to drought conditions.


